

Over the past eleven months, we have laid the foundation for a promising future through several key initiatives:

Firstly, our Blueprint 2030 is a comprehensive long-term plan designed to steer the OBU towards a bright and strategic future. This blueprint aligns with our goal of fostering champions both on and off the field through the Champions of Life Program, which nurtures the sports talents at St. Peter's College.

We have also embraced digital transformation, digitizing the OBU application process and introducing an online payment system to make things easier and more efficient for everyone. Our efforts to streamline social media and establish new brand guidelines are well underway, with the OBU Media Unit set to launch soon. Additionally, our One Global

Communication platform via the OBU News Room on WhatsApp keeps everyone connected.

We are extending OBUH Associate membership to committees of brother and sister schools and offering free membership to all senior Peterites.

Our gatherings have been vibrant and engaging, from a grand joint Christmas get-together to a spectacular Oktoberfest organized by the OBUH team. Our commitment to environmental, social, and governance initiatives is evident through several ongoing projects. Health initiatives such as medical camps for teachers, eye and dental clinics for students, and the annual Teachers' Day outing have been organized to ensure the well-being of our community. We continue to uphold our tradition of excellence in sports and feloowship through the Quadrangular and Gary Melder Trophy. The St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union (SPCOBU) dates back to the year 1927, the same year that St. Peter's was officially promulgated (changing its name from St. Joseph's College South to St. Peter's), when the Old Boys formed themselves into a Union. The first Rector, Rev. Fr. Nicholas Perera OMI was also the first President of the Old Boys' Union at its inauguration and up until Fr. Francis Madiwela (Rector in 1977) decided that the President of the OBU should be an Old Boy, Rectors continued to serve as Presidents. Since 1977, sixteen laymen have been Presidents and have rendered yeomen service to the OBU and College.

The Rectors who served as Ex-Officio Presidents of the OBU were Rev. Fathers D J Nicholas Perera OMI, Basil A Wiratunga OMI, Arthur Nicholas Fernando, Mervyn Weerakkody, Theodore Peiris OMI, Claver Perera and Francis Madiwela who rendered yeomen service to the OBU. During this period the Hony Secretary had an important role to play as the Chief Executive Officer. Among these indefatigable Secretaries, we have the pleasure of recalling the services rendered by M/s. Charles de Silva, Neville C R Weerasinghe (who served as the General Secretary for a considerable length of time), Major Edward Dias, P Julian Grero, Shirley Wijeratne, I M Wirasinghe and C E Maurice Perera.

When Fr. Francis Madiwela mooted the idea of a lay President for the OBU in 1977, a 3 man sub-committee comprising of M/s. J A R Felix (Chairman), C E Maurice Perera (Secretary) and George Wijesinghe were appointed to draft a new constitution which was unanimously adopted on the 4th of December that year and the first lay President of the OBU in the person of Mr. J A R Felix was unanimously elected while the Rector took up the post of Patron.

Since 1977 to date Mr. J A R Felix has been succeeded as President by M/s. Shelly Wickremasinghe, V P A Perera, Mano Chanmugam, General Deshamanya Denis Perera VSV, Ranjith Weerasena, C E Maurice Perera, DIG Camillus R Abeygoonewardena, Nivard Cabraal, Gerry de Mel, Mano Chanmugam, (who served 2 terms), Harin Gunawardena, Suranga Seneviratne, Roshan Dharmaratne, Surgeon Commodore Nielhaan Samaranayake, Surgeon Rear Admiral N E L W Jayasekera VSV USP, Romeish de Mel, Asela Lihinikaduwa, Ravika de Silva and the present incumbent Mr. Sanjeeva Abeygoonewardena who have, each in his own way, guided the destinies of the OBU with loyalty and dedication.

The Honorary General Secretaries during this period when lay Presidents led the OBU, have been no less diligent in the exercise of their duties and among them were M/s. Christie Rodrigo, Ernie Gunaratne, Terry William, Noel Jayasundera, Gerry de Mel (twice), Stanley Jayasinghe, Dunstan Fernando, Gihan Siribaddana, Nemantha Hatarasinghe, Kevin Edwards, Sriyan de Silva, Shehan D Fernando, Randy Roche, Haariz J Rahman (twice), Denver Rozairo, Algi Wijewickrema, Ravika de Silva and Dayan Georgesz. The present holder of this office is Mr. Johann Andrew Perera (Second Term).

M/s Ajit Jayamanne (thrice), Fazal Amirdeen, Francis R. Gomez, Hemantha Hatherasinghe, Harin Gunawardena, Dushantha Goonewardene, Kevin Edwards, Namal Gomes, Roshan Abeygoonewardena, Hashra Weerawardena, Shiran Yatagama, Dion Saverimuttu, Haariz Rahman and Dion Saverimuttu(Twice) have served the office of Treasurer managing the finances of the SPC OBU. Mr. Rajith Perera is the current holder of the office.

When speaking about the Old Boys' Union we cannot forget the different Foundations, Batch Groups, and Overseas Branches whose support to the SPC OBU and College have been invaluable. The Old boys of St. Peter's College Gampaha Branch were eligible to be members of the SPC OBU till 2019 when St. Peter's College Gampaha ceased to be a branch school of St. Peter's College Colombo for administrative purposes and formed their own alumni association.

The OBU has over 9,000 members and takes pride in the fact that the objectives of the Union as spelled out in the Constitution have been more than amply realised during these past 97 years.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT REPORT

The Committee of Management has the pleasure of submitting its Annual Report for the years 2023/24 together with the Financial Statements for the years ending 31st March.

As in the past, the OBU was closely involved with the College in providing support in whatever required form in the spheres of sports, academic activities and extra-curricular activities. Reports on the different activities that the OBU was involved in are set out in this report.

The President, Mr. Sanjeeva Abeygoonewardena set out 6 goals at the beginning of his term and together with his Committee of Management has been able to largely fulfil these goals. Below is a summary of the achievement.

In terms of the goal of a Charter for a long-term plan, the OBU was able to lay the ground work for a Blueprint which will carry the OBU until 2030. This will help improve the quality of the work that is done by the future Presidents and the Committee of Management hopes that this Blueprint will be built on and followed through in the years to come. In terms of Upgrades to the Union House, the opening of The Pitch: Karaoke Bar, BWG: Sports Bar, The Bamba Brigade Peterite Den and the refurbishment of the 1st floor meeting room which will be renamed the Patrons Auditorium are a testament to the developments. Training and Professional Development goals were achieved by the Student Well Being Center and the Career Guidance Center which were an initiative of the SPCOBU and will continue to operate the same.

In terms of Brand Reputation & Communications; the Global Newsroom (WhatsApp), the brand guidelines set, and the merging of the Peterite Media Unit are just a few initiatives. Consolidate and Collaborate as one: the Batches coming together to organize the very first Christmas Legacy event and Batch Groups supporting the OBU on fundraising for various events are a testament to that. And finally as usual, the SPCOBU continued its support of the administration and College affairs where events such as Teachers Health Camp, Eye Clinic and so on were organized.

Like every other year, none of the achievements of this year would have been possible without the contributions of the Subcommittees, Foundations and Batch Groups. These committees and their members need to be commended for the excellent work put in by them.

This year too we saw the emergence of another overseas branch which was the European Branch of SPCOBU. We look forward to working with this committee in building better connections to help the College in future projects.

Fundraising was also a success factor throughout the year with many small events and the main fundraising event which was the Golden Gleam Dance 2023. The dance was a grand success, and we hope that this tradition lives on in the years to come. All those who contributed towards the operations of the SPCOBU are therefore thanked sincerely which includes the Batch Groups, personal donors and well-wishers. The contributions to the Rev. Fr. Nicholas Perera Hall Project were also an indication of how when the old boys of this College come together anything can be achieved. The SPCOBU was also able to work together and bring to a close the court case which was carried forward from the previous year to amicably settle in court.

NOTE 1 PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of significant accounting policies is set out below ;

01 General Policies

1.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the Union are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and Sri Lanka Statement of Recommended Practices for Not-for-Profit Organisations laid down by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka. These statements are prepared on a historical cost basis.

02 Assets and Bases of their Valuation

2.1 Property, Plant and Equipment

The cost of Property, Plant and Equipment is the purchase or construction cost, together with any incidental expenses of acquisition.

Provision for depreciation is calculated by using a straight line method on the cost or valuation of all property, plant and equipment, other than freehold land, in order to write off such amounts over the estimated useful economic life of such assets. The estimated useful life of assets are as follows:

The depreciation is provided when the asset is available for use and stops when the asset is disposed or fully depreciated.

03 Liabilities and Provisions

All known liabilities have been accounted for in preparing the financial statements.

04 Statement of Financial Activities

4.1 Income Recognition

Income is accounted on cash basis except for sales at the union house lounge and hoarding income.

4.2 Expenditure Recognition

Expenses are recognized in the income statement on the basis of a direct association between the cost incurred and the earning of specific items of income. All expenditure incurred in the running of the Union and in maintaining the property, plant and equipment in a state of efficiency has been charged to the income statement.


