THE OLD BOYS' UNION

The Old Boys' Union (OBU) of St. Peter's College dates back to the year 1927, the same year that St. Peter's was officially promulgated (changing its name from St. Joseph's College South to St. Peter's), when the Old Boys formed themselves into a Union. The first Rector, Rev. Fr. Nicholas Perera OMI was also the first President of the Old Boys' Union at its inauguration and up until Fr. Francis Madiwela (Rector in 1977) decided that the President of the OBU should be an Old Boy, Rectors continued to serve as Presidents. Since 1977, sixteen laymen have been Presidents and have rendered yeomen service to the OBU and College.

The Rectors who served as Ex-Officio Presidents of the OBU were Rev. Fathers D J Nicholas Perera OMI, Basil A Wiratunga OMI, Arthur Nicholas Fernando, Mervyn Weerakkody, Theodore Peiris OMI, Claver Perera and Francis Madiwela who rendered yeomen service to the OBU. During this period the Honorary Secretary had an important role to play as the Chief Executive Officer. Among these indefatigable Secretaries, we have the pleasure of recalling the services rendered by M/s. Charles de Silva, Neville C R Weerasinghe (who served as the General Secretary for a considerable length of time), Major Edward Dias, P Julian Grero, Shirley Wijeratne, I M Wirasinghe and C E Maurice Perera.

When Fr. Francis Madiwela mooted the idea of a lay President for the OBU in 1977, a 3 man sub-committee comprising of M/s. J A R Felix (Chairman), C E Maurice Perera (Secretary) and George Wijesinghe were appointed to draft a new constitution which was unanimously adopted on the 4th of December that year and the first lay President of the OBU in the person of Mr. J A R Felix was unanimously elected while the Rector took up the post of Patron.

Since 1977 to date Mr. J A R Felix has been succeeded as President by M/s. Shelly Wickremasinghe, V P A Perera, Mano Chanmugam, General Deshamanya Denis Perera VSV, Ranjith Weerasena, C E Maurice Perera, DIG Camillus R Abeygoonewardena, Nivard Cabraal, Gerry de Mel, Mano Chanmugam, (who served 2 terms), Harin Gunawardena, Suranga Seneviratne, Roshan Dharmaratne, Surgeon Commodore Nielhaan Samaranyake, Surgeon Rear Admiral N E L W Jayasekera VSV USP, Romeish de Mel, Asela Lihinikaduwa and the present incumbent Mr. Ravika de Silva who have, each in his own way, guided the destinies of the OBU with loyalty and dedication.

The Honorary General Secretaries during this period when lay Presidents led the OBU, have been no less diligent in the exercise of their duties and among them were M/s. Christie Rodrigo, Ernie Gunaratne, Terry William, Noel Jayasundera, Gerry de Mel (twice), Stanley Jayasinghe, Dunstan Fernando, Gihan Siribaddana, Nemantha Hatarasinghe, Kevin Edwards, Sriyan de Silva, Shehan D Fernando, Randy Roche, Haariz J Rahman (twice), Denver Rozairo, Algi Wijewickrema and Ravika de Silva. The present holder of this office is Mr. Johann Andrew Perera.

When speaking about the Old Boys' Union we cannot forget the different Foundations, Batch Groups, and Overseas Branches whose support to the SPC OBU and College have been invaluable. The Old boys of St. Peter's College Gampaha Branch were eligible to be members of the SPC OBU till 2019 when St. Peter's College Gampaha ceased to be a branch school of St. Peter's College Colombo for administrative purposes and formed their own alumni association.

The OBU has over 8000 members and takes pride in the fact that the objectives of the Union as spelled out in the Constitution have been more than amply realised during these past 95 years.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT REPORT

The Committee of Management has the pleasure of submitting its Annual Report for the years 2020/21 & 2021/22 together with the Financial Statements for the years ending 31st March 2021 & 31st March 2022. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the AGM of 2021 was not held. However, the Committee of Management requested the permission of the General Membership to continue its term for an additional year notwithstanding any provision in the constitution to which over 90% of the quorum voted in favour at the Special General Meeting held on 10th December 2022. This is the reason that unlike in previous years the Annual Report will be compiled for two years instead of one. This Report was duly adopted by the Committee of Management at its meeting held on 17th June 2022.

As in the past, the OBU was closely involved with the College in providing support in whatever required form in the spheres of sports, academic activities and extra-curricular activities. Reports on the different activities that the OBU was involved in are set out in this report.

The President Mr. Ravika de Silva focused his attention on all Batch Groups and he attended many events and AGMs of the Batch Groups which are active at present (Pre 70s, 71-74, 83-86, 87-92, 93-94, 95-2000, 2001-03, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013-17 and 2018-19). The Batch Groups have submitted their reports of activities which are included herein.

In lieu of the Centenary Year, the President further focused his attention on connecting many Peterites from around the world. This was the foundation for Peterite Connect which with the help of many Old Boys will be made a reality in the year 2022.

During the period under review the overseas branches, Canada, Dubai, Melbourne, Qatar, Sydney, New Zealand, United Kingdom and Washington were actively engaged in promoting the objectives of the OBU.

The contribution by the Sub-Committees, Batch Groups, and Foundations in supporting the OBU and College was indeed praiseworthy. The Chairmen and Presidents of these Sub-Committees, Batch Groups and Foundations need to be commended for the excellent work done by them.

As in 2020, the COVID-19 Pandemic continued to disrupt the operations of the SPCOBU. For a second year in a row, the 'Golden Gleam' Dinner dance was cancelled in light of this. This had a major impact on the fundraising side and limited the activities of the SPCOBU. However, thanks to the many generous Old Boys and the launch of a Raffle Draw, we were able to recover and fulfil the main obligations.

In the last quarter of 2021/22, another major obstacle had to be overcome when for the first time in the history of the Old Boys' Union, an ex-parte Enjoining order was obtained by 3 members of the OBU against the Rector of St. Peter's College along with the President, Secretary and the OBU. This had a major impact as all operations had to be ceased until the order was vacated.

Now more than ever it is understood that virtual connectivity is the way forward for any organization. This is one of the main lessons learned globally from the Corona Virus Pandemic. For this reason, with the leadership of the President, The Peterite Connect Initiative was launched where a mobile app will be used to connect Peterites from around the world. The app is still its Beta version and is being tested as of now and hoped to be launched in the 4th quarter of 2022.

LIVING THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

The SPCOBU organized a Prayer Service Virtually on the 15 August 2021 for all the Peterites, current and old along with their families and the staff of College, who were suffering at the height of the Pandemic. Many batch groups and Foundations followed suit and held Prayer services as well.

What should be highlighted above all else is how so many Peterites came forward to 'Lend a Heart and Lend a Hand' to so many who were suffering through the pandemic financially. Batch Groups, Foundations and even Overseas Branches joined hand to contribute financially and through dry rations to those who had lost their jobs or were suffering throughout the pandemic. The SPCOBU does not claim responsibility for the amazing work done but wishes to state it for the record which was an overwhelming response which we believe were contributions of over Rs. 20 Million around the Globe.

WEBINARS

As there were no possibilities of meeting physically, there were many Webinars organized by the Peterite Empowerment Subcommittee which helped many Old Boys' during the Pandemic and the lockdown days. The webinars were organized in many topics including Covid Vaccinations, How to handle Covid, Financial Management and many more. The Academic Foundation too organized a set of Webinars for the students in College especially for those who sat for their Ordinary Examinations covering the subject of selecting the right stream for the Advanced Level.

COLLEGE CREST & OBU CREST UPDATE

It was pointed out by Rev. Fr. Rector that the College Crest part of the OBU Crest was incorrect. There was a box behind the cross on the top of the Crest which was not a part of the original design. The Crest hanging at the College Hall had the box as a way to support the Cross as it had broken off. Once Rev. Fr. Rector pointed out the same it was moved to change all the Crests of the OBU and its sub organizations.

The Hon. General Secretary, by order of the Committee of Management published a Crest Usage Guideline for all Batch Groups, Subcommittees, Foundations and Over Seas branches to follow in the future in order to have consistency and uniformity.

DATABASE RENEWAL

The Committee of Management was able to launch a database renewal for members in order to better communicate with them. This renewal had an over whelming response where the details of over 1200 members were updated and were able to communicate with them via email.

COMMEMORATION OF THE 3 AIR VICE MARSHALS

The SPCOBU together with the Cadet Foundation hosted a commemoration for the 3 Air Vice Marshals of the Sri Lanka Air Force. On the invitation of the Rector of St. Peter's College, three Distinguished Old Boys in the rank of Air Vice Marshal of the Sri Lanka Air Force visited College to be commemorated for their Immense Service to Country and for bringing honour to their Alma Mater. This is the first time in the history of College that 3 Old Boys are a part of the Sri Lanka Air Force Board of Management (AFBM). The 3 Old Peterites were Air Vice Marshal Andrew Wijesuriya (Deputy Chief of Staff - SLAF), Air Vice Marshal Camillus Labrooy (Director - Ground Operations - SLAF) and Air Vice Marshal Roshan Biyanwila (Director - Administration, SLAF)



ENJOINING ORDER AGAINST THE SPCOBU

In the last quarter of 2021/22, another major obstacle was encountered, when for the first time in the history of the SPC OBU, an ex-parte Enjoining order was obtained by 3 members namely M/s Algi Wijewickreme, Ramesh Fonseka and Srilal Jayamaha against the Rector of St. Peter's College along with the President and the Secretary as representing the SPC OBU (DC COLOMBO CASE NO. DSP20/2022). Their claim was inter alia that the term of office of the incumbent COM was not properly extended at an SGM. This had a major impact as operations of the SPC OBU had to cease. The order was delivered within a week of St. Peter's College celebrating its centenary.

The Respondents defended their legal position and duly filed their statement of objections. The court, having considered the matter, vacated the Enjoining order.

The order vacating the said enjoining order was delivered on 24th March 2022 which enabled the SPC OBU to resume functions after a few weeks.

The plaintiffs being aggrieved by the said order dated 24/03/2022 appealed to the provincial high court in case no. WP/HCCA/COL/155/2022/LA which has not been fully supported at the time of writing this report.

The COM has also decided to file a cross claim against the Plaintiffs seeking damages for the losses caused.

The COM has decided to strongly resist the claim and the appeal so as to vindicate its legal rights.

REPORTS ON THE OBUH, OPSC AND THE SPORTS FOUNDATIONS

OLD BOYS' UNION HOUSE (OBUH)

This term was a difficult and challenging period for OBUH and lounge operations as most period of this term was affected by the pandemic which left the Lounge closed due to health restrictions or open with limited activities.

Even with these external difficulties and with the strong support of the committee members, the OBUH operations in 2020/2021 were conducted with a net surplus of Rs. 3.0 million and in the year 2021/2022, we were short of only Rs. 23,000 given the fact that the Lounge was closed most part of the year due to the effect of three pandemic waves and an Enjoining Order.

Despite the difficulties, we were able to conduct many activities and entertainment events to give opportunities to our members to meet their batch mates and friends and in the process build much needed revenue for OBUH and meet our operating expenses. We also launched a successful

"Dinner for 2" delivery campaign to raise revenues whilst the Lounge was closed due to health restrictions.

In Q3, lounge operations were disrupted due to the third wave of the pandemic. In order to meet operating cost, a special 'Dinner for 2' home delivery campaign was launched to activate orders and bring in much needed revenue to the Lounge. The project was active till January 2022 and was able to bring a net income of Rs. 189,125 to the OBUH to ease the burden in meeting operation costs at a time the Lounge was closed.

SPCOBU SECRETARIAT MAINTANANCE

The Old Boys Union Building Committee consists of the technical committee and other appointed members of the general committee of the main OBU. With the sole objective of maintaining the premises, developing the facility and to support the lounge committee for their day to day activities.

The passing year has been a challenging year similarly as per the other sub committees and due to the closure of the facility

due to unprecedented situation and lack of opportunity in having fundraiser activities the objective was only to maintain the premise for the best of everyone. The committee had to undergo plumbing and electrical maintenance projects with the approval of the technical committee as they were needed at the time. But as a long term strategic view it was agreed that the electrical plans and plumbing plans should be relooked at and have the best way forward with the support of technical personnel in the industry.

The building committee helped the Lounge committee's move to have the caterer relocate to the 2nd floor as per the master plan passed initially this was agreed by the committee. The establishing and fixing of the new kitchen exhaust project was done under the purview of the main OBU which was led by Suren Perera and concluded within the timeline for the new caterer to move in.

The building committee moved ahead with a proactive approach of moving towards development as per the master plan in laying the foundation of fund collection for the 1st floor Mini Auditorium project which is led by Sanushka Perea. The project was estimated to be at 8,599,075.00, however due to the cost of material and good going up this will have to be re-evaluated.

It was discussed and agreed that all future developments of the Old Boy Union Building will be made as per the master plan which has been passed initially at Committee Meetings before hand

OLD PETERITES' SPORTS CLUB (OPSC)

Initially we did a review to identify where the Old boys who are involved with Sport activities where foundations are not formed. Cadet, Swimming, Badminton and also to revive the Cricket foundation were identified. Cadet foundation was formed and actively involved with the College management to develop the cadetting. Cricket revival was affected due to the Pandemic. Individual reports of Rugby, Cadeting and Football are given separately in this report. The Inaugural meeting of the swimming foundation was held on the 1st of June.

Due to Pandemic and Social distancing concern the Quadrangular tournament and Inter Batch Cricket Tournament was postponed.



SWIMMING FOUNDATION

The Inaugural Annual General Meeting of the St. Peters College Swimming Foundation was held on June 1st, 2022, at the OBU Secretariat. The meeting was presided over by Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo and the President of the OBU, Mr. Ravika de Silva.

The newly elected committee discussed topics related to the goals of the foundation. This included; how best to provide mentorship to the swimmers, developing existing infrastructure, and streamlining areas that require coordinating between various parties.

BASKETBALL FOUNDATION (BF)

An uneventful year for the basketball foundation, despite planned events aimed at the popularization and development of basketball at St Peter's College. Most efforts were focused on the continuity of the sport and offering support to teams taking part in tournaments, in order to sustain the winning culture of Peterite Basketball.

- Gala Dinner hosted @ Xilalton Colombo to commemorate the U-19 team that emerged 2nd Runner up in the 'U-20 All island A division Basketball Championship'.

- Operational support - food supplied for a full day practice session, indoor court bookings arranged @ Sugathadasa indoor.

FOOTBALL FOUNDATION

We had our first meeting with all the committee members at the College club house on 24/09/2020. A few changes in the committee were done since there were some issues with the OBU membership of a few of our committee members. We have decided to amend the constitution & appoint another Vice President to the Football Foundation.

Due to the pandemic situation of the country we didn't have any chance to get involved in the College soccer activities. But we were in touch with our newly appointed OBU committee in order to lend a helping hand to the activities of the College. After the country became normal the President & the Secretary met the new Master in-charge of soccer Mr. Francis Sarath and had a casual chat with him regarding the situation of the College soccer. We had our first committee meeting after the reopening of the country on 11/02/2022 & we invited our newly appointed MIC, Mr. Fransis Sarath for this meeting. Our MIC informed us that the College sports board has decided to have an Inter-school soccer tournament for the jubilee & soccer is the only sport that is approved to have a tournament & he requested us to prepare a proposal for the Tournament.

We requested the MIC to inform us of any needs (Technical or Material) that would rise with regard to College soccer. After the 1st meeting we had our 2nd meeting on the 25/02/2022 at Big John Hotel Mount Lavinia to discuss about the soccer tournament. In that meeting we went through the proposal of the tournament & finalized it with few changes and after that due to the main OBU committee conflict we didn't have any official meetings of the Football Foundation.

The College sports board along with the Rev. Fr. Rector had decided to change the Football coaches of the school & to get our former head coach Mr. Isuru Perera again. On 28/03/2022 our new coach came for the practices & some of our committee members also visited to see him & to wish him good luck.

We had our next official committee meeting on 26/04/2022 & finalized the tournament proposal on this day. We requested our MIC to get an appointment to meet Rev. Fr. Rector & the Sports Coordinator to present the tournament proposal.

We were able to meet Rev. Fr. Rector on 04/05/2022 at the Rector's office, in accordance with the appointment obtained. Few of our committee members, along with the MIC, football Mr. Francis Sarath & OBU President Mr. Ravika De Silva met Rev. Fr. Rector.

We presented the proposal for the tournament & discussed the matter. Rev. Fr. Rector approved the proposal and instructed to proceed accordingly & advised us to reach the college for any further support.

RUGBY FOUNDATION (RF)

Though it's been a lull 2 years, the Rugby Foundation has been actively engaged with Rector, Sports Coordinator, college authorities, coaching staff and our sponsors.

2020 was a great year for St. Peters Rugby. We were able to raise the highest amount of sponsorship in the history of the College with commitments for the next 3 years. We are grateful to TDM International, Cargills, Trip A Deal /Aitken Spence and 3PL EFL. A grand press briefing and sponsor felicitation ceremony was held at the Cinnamon Grand. The value of the brand - "Peterite Rugby" has soared over the last 10 years and grateful thanks to all our supporters, social media teams, students and marketing/ promotion committees of the RF

There was no change in the coaching staff and they continued their excellent performance molding our young Peterites from Under 10 to Under 16 and the senior teams U18 and 1st XV. We won all our matches until the season abruptly ended in March 2022 after 2 games due to the pandemic. Coaching continued having online sessions on a weekly basis.

The 13th Annual General Meeting was held on the 20th of September 2020. Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo addressing the AGM thanked the Rugby Foundation (RF) for the valued contribution and advise. He also mentioned the RF comes forward in a big way in supporting Rugby at St Peters. It was unfortunate the season could not be completed due to the Covid Pandemic and wished the boys all the very best. He thanked RF president Mangala and the committee for the invaluable contribution and for being there at all times with College.

Coaching during the pandemic continued online and we are grateful to the College authorities for looking after the interest of all our coaches. We were one of the 2 schools to do so during the pandemic.

A team comprising Trinesh Fernando, Fazal Mohamed, Dilshan Perera, Sanjeeva Abeygoonawardena, Dasty Ismail, Samson Roy and Managala Dharmapriya worked with the Centenary Publication committee in compiling the article related to College rugby.

St Peters College emerged champions in the Western Province segment A Sevens tournament in 2021. This was the only tournament played during the year. The Team was captained by Ishan Fernando and coached by Sanath Martis.

2022 is promising with all teams back in the grounds training hard. Tournaments are scheduled from May/June onwards. The 1st 1XV squad is captained by Master Sudesh Jayawickrama. Once again, we are on course to sign up a record sponsorship contracts for St Peters College for 2022 with key signings in place already.

The 14th AGM is scheduled to be held on the 17th of July 2022.

TRACK & FIELD FOUNDATION (T&F FOUNDATION)

CADET FOUNDATION

The Cadet Foundation of St. Peter's College was installed on February 13 2021. Keeping with Peterite tradition, a holy Eucharistic celebration followed by a salute at the College's 'Memorial of the Gallant' led to the formal forum. The formalities were presided over by Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo in his capacity as Rector of the College and Patron of the Cadet Foundation. Further distinguished invites from OBU including President Mr. Ravika De Silva witnessed the installation and electing of office bearers for the inaugural committee.

A committee of 13 amongst ranks were elected where Mr. Dilan Wijesuriya as President, Mr. Lakmal Perera & late Mr. Suresh Dias as Hon. Secretary & Treasurer respectively. The IGM saw over 70 ranks from pre-seventies to new millennia falling in line under one motive & comradeship. While our Ex-cadets serving was seen in full dress uniform, ex-servicemen were observed in gentlemen's attire with medals of gallantry - honour pinned shining closer to heart.

It was the collective vision in establishing the cadet foundation of St. Peter's College that the foundation will and is established with pure motives of;

1. Giving back generously to the College/platoon
2. Continued comradeship amongst ex-cadets of collective eras.

The committee elected was entrusted and vested in planning, executing and achieving targets within the mandate of the foundation for the upholding of the above two primary lines of vision.

Operations and Projects

2021/22 Giving back generously - Whilst the committee was drawing boards to sand model stage of planning, the global pandemic barraged over Sri Lanka for the 3rd wave in April 2021. As a nation, already battered by two back to back waves

in the year 2021 this was a definitive setback for our new formation - the Cadet Foundation of St. Peter's College (CFSPC). Determined & 'Never being Unprepared' resources were swift to couple up with technology. CFSPC was the first to take advantage of the closure of academics (with its extra-curricular activities), where our training sub-committee led by Mr. Malshan Dissanayaka & Mr. Dillion Henderlin digitalized training of College cadets. The foundation was able to establish a program where members took time off to conduct lectures in academics of National Cadet Corps approved and issued syllabus. Going one step further the foundation developed pre choreographed videos for the benefit of the College cadets as physical training table audio visual aids. The project was well executed with overwhelming hands calling in to assist both front of screen and behind curtains.

CFSPC has also arranged and lined up lecturers with wider domain knowledge for the benefit of the college platoon. They include advanced training delivery in First Aid, firefighting, field craft, map reading, military, police and legal studies. Further with assistance from our advisory board of serving ranks CFSPC also has drawn up plans to take up training college platoon in weapons drill and physical training under the supervision of qualified DI's & PTT's. The committee has already informed college authorities of the above and awaits the green light for the commencement of this advanced phase of training. The committee built & continues to maintain a healthy relationship with the commanding officer and battalion headquarters 3NCC. This has been a strength and proven success in our short journey thus far as the Commanding Officer and HQ has been always welcoming us to CFSPC at our calls and needs of assistance sought.

The Committee and membership of CFSPC have identified a crucial need for the allotment of a permanent, formal and geared 'cadet room' for the platoon in college premises. The president & committee has already taken up the matter with college authorities and has concluded that funds are an obstacle in making such a reality. Hence above we have planned and designed a program towards a sustainable funding goal. The goal of the fundraiser was pending due to reasons of global pandemic health hazard and as of present, political and socio economic reasons. No sooner we see a window for launch; the committee and membership will execute this project towards our common goal of 'Cadet Room' for the platoon. The sketch is also drawn up for the establishment of a miniature air rifle range in college which too will coincide with a fundraiser campaign together with generous donations from carder.

Peterite Centenary

The celebration of our glorious flagships centenary which is a 'once in a lifetime' occasion too, is to be celebrated by CFSPC with two events (pending approval by college authorities);

1. St. Peter's College Centenary challenge trophy battalion drill competition. The competition is a non-profit event where CFSPC in conjunction with 3NCC and National Headquarters, Sri Lanka Defense Cadet Corps organizes an invitation squad drill competition.
2. 'Mini Searchlight Tattoo - CFSPC with assistance and guidance by serving and ex. serviceman (ex. cadets and non-cadet old Peterite's from tri services and police) bring a mini tattoo to college for it will be a definitive event with glamour lasting a century to come. This event is expected to be the backbone fundraiser for the proposed 'cadet room' and 'miniature air rifle range' for college and the platoon.

Both above projects are overseen by Mr. Hasanka Gomis in his capacity of sub-committee chair and are ready for launch on receipt of clearances by college authorities and external stakeholders/factors respectively.
Continued Comradeship amongst ex. Cadets of Collective eras.

In the captioned area, CFSPC's first was a mini fundraiser which saw confirmation of our uniformity by all members being invited to purchase and bear our very own T Shirt. The project was well led and executed by project sub-committee head Mr. Indrajith Padidilan who was ably assisted by Mr. Jehan Karunaratna.

Going global CFSPC was able to be Sri Lanka's first of its kind of an outfit to claim proud ownership of a website (www.spccadets.lk). This too was a hallmark identity builder which was led by Mr. Kishore Vitanachy and again seen assisted by master crafter Mr. Heshan Rodrigo.

The committee itself, keeping established guidelines and protocols, has continued to meet on Wednesdays every second week of the month (except for 2 months where the court of law held an injunction on functions of OBU SPC). All meetings are continued to be minuted and finances are tabled by Hon. Treasurer Mr. Walter Noel who is a chartered accountant by profession.

Furthermore given due respect to prevailing economic stress, but keeping formalities upheld, CFSPC called in for voluntary membership donations 2021/22, where the comradeship spread around the globe came forward within their own capacities

in contributing towards our collective cause. Mr. Sheron Fernando, then in his capacity as assistant secretary spearheaded to a successful closure of this with the late Mr. Suresh Dias and Mr. Jehan Karunaratna assisting in.

Expanding our outreach CFSPC answered a call from our battalion headquarters where we generously 'lend a heart and hand' towards a repair/redoing of battalion headquarters main access gate which was followed by a donation of a digital projector screen for the use of 3NCC activities.

Furthermore, a mention should be made that Lieutenant Colonel. Shirantha Goonawardena's unconditional support towards college and CFSPC. Lieutenant Colonel. Shirantha generously accepted our call to facilitate a parade by college cadets at the grand celebration of the Centenary on January 18, 2022 at College premises. The officer & gentleman has been a guide to us at CFSPC where he facilitated and presided over the 2022 rank insignia 'pinning-on' parade both at battalion and college levels. The commanding officer in his capacity extended an invitation to CFSPC President Mr. Dilan Wijesuriya to the 2022 Battalion Day Celebrations at 3 NCC headquarters and the ceremony held for the installation of the Senior Non-commissioned officers of the 3rd battalion.

Since February 13 2021, It has been a journey of establishment and where now, we at CFSPC are at the early stages of seeing us beginning the 'level & cruising stage' in a flight where we strongly believe that descending is none existent. Our strengths in this flight will definitely be our college' the mother ship of carrier strike group cutting through waters under the Blue White & Gold flag. The comradeship as an elite squadron of the diverse crew that will ensure our airworthiness in battles ahead.



ARTS FOUNDATION

St. Peter's College has a rich history in the Arts & Music, both oriental and western disciplines, having won many competitions at the interschool/All island level in choral music, orchestra/band performance, debating and drama whilst producing some well recognized professionals in these fields over the years, in all three language streams. To ensure the continuation of this rich tradition, it was proposed to create a foundation that would cover the above co-curricular activities to explore how these streams could be developed at College. Health & Eye Camp

After conclusion of the opening ceremony the Health & Eye camp was conducted at the Rev. Fr. Nicholas Perera Memorial Hall for all our teachers , past Teachers & College staff ,. In addition health check ups were done with the best assistance of few old peterites (Doctors) specialized on following ailments such as Diabetic, Asthma, Oncology, neuro, gyn & obs, eye ect..Eye camp was conducted with the support of Vision Care . The entire program was conducted by medical professionals guided by the Hemas Hospital & ,Vision Care worth over a budget of LKR 400,000 sponsored by the 2002 Batch group together with a 50% discount from Hemas Hospital.





FINANCE SUB-COMMITTEE

The objective of the Finance Sub-committee is to enhance the visibility of the finance function of the St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union by maintaining transparency in finances.

During the Financial Year 2020/21 the Committee was involved with the finalization and submission of the financial statements to the external auditors for the purpose of the re-audit as per the request of the Re-Audit Monitoring Committee Appointed by the Rector. The Finance Committee together with the Treasurer of the OBU made necessary arrangements to submit the relevant information to the Auditors for the purpose of the Re-Audit. The Finance committee was involved in responding to the Management Letter points issued by the Auditors relating to the Re-Audit especially involved in reviewing the draft responses of the OBU and shared it's views and feedback to the COM at the time of their approval prior to sharing the responses with the external auditors

Finance committee ratified the capital expenses submitted by the respective committee relating to the Old Boys' Union House kitchen exhaust

Further Finance Committee re-iterated the need for the formal supplier and vendor selection process to maintain the transparency of all outsourcing arrangements by introducing the Request for Proposal (RFP) process where the OBU will provide all information of the outsourcing facilities through the RFP document where interested bidders will be allowed to take part the bid. This will enable an independent committee to review all bids and take appropriate actions.

Finance Committee reviewed and provided feedback on the OBUH Annual budget. Committee advised the OBUH sub-committee on the importance of factoring the pandemic impact especially in determining the Revenue Budget.

Finance Committee was involved in the finalization of the financial statements audit for the financial year ending 31st March 2020 where the Audit was finalized on the 30th September 2021.

Finance Committee released the Request for Proposal for the Hoarding Board on the 25th May 2021 with a mandatory closing date of 30th June 2021 where all suppliers were requested to submit their Bids. All bids were critically reviewed and selected the AAT Sri Lanka to award the contract. A Legal agreement between the parties for the hoarding board was entered on 27th October 2021.

Special General Meeting (SGM) of the St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union was held on 10/12/2021 and the re-audited financial statements of the OBU was tabled for approval by the members. The financial statements were approved by majority of votes in favour of the re-audited financial statements.

As per the request of the OBUH Sub-committee Request for Proposal was drafted by the finance committee for the Evaluation of the In-house caterer was drafted and submitted to the sub-committee chairman for comments and feedback.

Finance Committee ratified the budget for the raffle draw where the draw was held on 10th of December 2021

Finance Committee recommended the following to enhance the Integrity of the financial Reporting Process

Auditor Rotation policy for the OBU to be in place to enhance the independence of the External Auditors
Requirement to Separately Audit Significant Projects of the SPC OBU which carries a Profit above LKR 2mn. As a result it was agreed by members to separately audit the financial statements of the main fund raiser of the OBU “ Golden Gleam” and any other related projects which captures in the respective definition.

Responsibilities of Management Committee and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management Committee is responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with Sri Lanka Statement of Recommended Practices for Not-for-Profit Organizations and for such internal control as management Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management Committee is responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management Committee either intends to liquidate the Entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

NOTE 1

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of significant accounting policies is set out below ;

01 General Policies

1.1 Basis of Preparation

MINUTES OF THE 92ND ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The minutes of the 92nd Annual General Meeting of the Old Boys' Union of St. Peter's College, Colombo 4, held on Sunday, 27th September 2020 at the D. J. Nicholas Perera Hall.

The meeting commenced at 10.30 a.m. with the President, Mr. Asela Lihinikaduwa in the chair.

After the Honorary General Secretary, Mr. Ravika De Silva read the Notice convening the Annual General meeting, at the request of the President, Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo, Rector/Patron led the gathering in prayer.

Attendance

A total of 987 members had signed the attendance register.

Excuses

M/s. Navin Perera, Rudolph Wijayanayaka and Steve Wijayanayaka had requested to be excused.

In Memoriam

Two minutes' silence was observed in memory of the deceased members, staff of St. Peter's College and students as reported in the Annual Report based on information received by the Committee and the names were mentioned at the meeting.

Adoption of the Minutes of the 91st Annual General Meeting

The President informed the house that the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting (91st AGM) was included in the Annual Report for the year 2019/20. It had been made available to members via the OBU website and distributed among those present at the AGM. He requested the members to adopt the minutes.

Mr. Pramoda Karunathileke proposed the adoption of the minutes of the 91st Annual General Meeting and was seconded by Mr. Suren A. Perera

Adoption of the Annual Report for the Year 2019/20.

The Annual Report for the year 2019/20 had been made available to members via the OBU website and had been made available to the members present. The President requested the house to consider the following amendments prior to the adoption

- Page 15 - Remove Mr. Gerry de Mel's name from the Foundation Co-ordination Sub-committee
- Page 72 – Correction of typographical error “DIG Mr. Camillus Abeygoonewardena (Retd.)”
- Page 80 – Correction of typographical error “Rev. Fr. Trevor Martin – Farewell”

Mr. Ramesh Fonseka requested for a confirmation with regard to the date the Annual Report was tabled and confirmed by the Committee of Management. The President said it was 10th September 2020 while the initial draft was tabled on of 27th August 2020.

Subject to the above corrections the Annual Report 2019/20 was adopted, proposed by Mr. Damitha Gomez and seconded by Dr. Pradeep Edward.

Adoption of the Audited Statement of Account for the Year 2019/20.

The President requested that the Statement of Accounts as made available in the Annual Report for the year 2019/20, be approved.

Mr. Ksham Ranasinghe requested clarification about income related to the LED screen which was not recorded in the Financial Statements. He referred to 4.1 of the Principal Accounting Policies in the Notes to the Financial Statements in this regard.

The Treasurer said that they consulted the Auditors and was informed to table the signed agreement along with the request letter from the vendor at a Committee Meeting and decide. Once the payment is received, then the income can be recorded based on the decision made. The payment was not received during the mentioned period as the agreement between the

parties involved was that the electricity supply for the LED Screen will be provided by the OBUH. The President stated that up to the date of the AGM the electricity supply was still not provided continuously. Mr. Ranasinghe then said that it appears that the auditors are contradicting the policy mentioned in their Auditor Report.

The President mentioned that the audited accounts will be corrected if necessary and said that he will refer the matter to the auditors and provide their response to the membership.

Dr. Harin Gunawardena addressed the house and explained that no one can change the Audited report, therefore due to the conflicting policy of the Auditor, the members have lost faith in the Auditor. If faith in the Auditor is lost, and according to the concern raised by Mr. Ksham Ranasinghe the financial statements cannot be adopted. If the financial statements are not adopted then the AGM cannot proceed. He also said that there is a precedent of this at the SPC OBU where an AGM was adjourned, and therefore theoretically the AGM should be adjourned.

Dr. Pradeep Edward suggested that a Special General Meeting (SGM) be held to resolve the specific issue. Then the President mentioned that an SGM will be convened to address the adoption of the Financial Statements after clarification is received from the auditors. Dr. Harin Gunawardena then mentioned that the President seems to have no knowledge of handling an AGM as when the Accounts are not adopted then the AGM cannot proceed. He further stated due to this concern of not recording the hoarding income in the Audited Accounts Statements, faith is lost in the Auditor and he recommended to change the Auditor.

The house was not happy with the motion of stopping the AGM until the Statement of Accounts was passed and was given a loud objection.

After a short discussion between Dr. Harin Gunawardena, Mr. Gerry de Mel and Mr. Ajith Jayamanne, members agreed to proceed with the AGM and to address the concern at an SGM after verification from the Auditors.

Address by the Patron on the Affairs of the College

Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo, Patron of the St. Peter's College OBU and Rector of St. Peter's College addressed the house. At the outset he recorded his thanks to all his predecessors, the former Rectors and other priests, teachers and other staff who had contributed to bring St. Peter's College to the current high standards.

He said that education was the number one priority at St. Peter's College. Sports, Co-curricular activities, extracurricular activities were also considered important and due emphasis and recognition were given together with the importance placed on classroom learning.

As the Rector he will be focusing on the integral education and his vision will be to develop with the Catholic Education methods. All students need to become mature citizens with Catholic values. The present culture in College is appreciated by many. School is always considered the second home and the entire College management is focusing and taking necessary steps to ensure that all students will be happy and have a memorable school life.

Rev. Fr. Rector appreciated Old Boys for the binding and commitment towards the Alma-mater and the attitude to give back to College. It is testified by the support given whenever there is a requirement. The values are testified by the actions of the old boys. It is evident that Peterites always keep the Blue, White and Gold flag flying high. The generosity and passion to develop St. Peter's College is significant. That is the main reason it has created a demand for admission to St. Peter's College when a parent is deciding on a school for the child.

The present situation will possibly lead to global challenges with many economical changes. He went on to thank all members of the OBU, Batch Groups, OBU Branches and Foundations for the support extended to him as the Rector. He said that all involved are doing their best to do better in all aspects of education.

Address by the outgoing President

Mr. Asela Lihinikaduwa thanked Fr. Rector on behalf of the OBU membership for hosting the traditional breakfast which was much looked forward to by all old boys. He thanked the members present for attending in such large numbers. He said that it was an honour for him to have served the OBU as President. He thanked the Committee of Management for extending their support to him.

He apologised for the confusion regarding the accounts. He said that it was a great pleasure to serve as the President for the last three years. He appreciated all Batch Groups who came forward as one family and the unity shown. He especially thanked all who attended the AGM and it was nice to see a large crowd present. He extended his gratitude to all the Foundations, Overseas Branches and all Peterites who supported the College and OBU.

He requested everyone to support Rev. Fr. Rector and new Committee of Management to organize all centenary activities on a grand scale.

In his closing remarks he mentioned that he got involved and committed to OBU activities mainly due to late Dr. Nielhan Samaranayake and the words he mentioned “You are here today because of your College and you cannot repay that to College”

Resolutions if Any

There was one resolution presented by Mr. Johann Andrew Perera and seconded by Mr. Trevin Fernandopulle. The basis of the resolution was that 2 extra committee members be added in the category of 5 years after leaving College. The President requested the house to pass this resolution to which they unanimously agreed. The amended constitution should read as follows.

“Section 7 (a)

7. COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

The management of the affairs of the Union shall be vested in a Committee of Management comprising of the Patron and the Office Bearers holding the offices, specified in rules 6c - 6k and seventeen elected members of whom:

- i. At least 2 Shall have left the College at least 40 years before the date of election.
- ii. At least 2 shall have left the College between 35 years and 39 years before the date of election.
- iii. At least 2 shall have left the College between 30 years and 34 years before the date of election.
- iv. At least 2 shall have left the College between 25 years and 29 years before the date of election.
- v. At least 2 shall have left the College between 20 years and 24 years before the date of election.
- vi. At least 2 shall have left the College between 15 years and 19 years before the date of election.
- vii. At least 2 shall have left the College between 10 years and 14 years before the date of election.
- viii. At least 2 shall have left the College between 9 years and 5 years before the date of election.
- ix. At least 2 shall have left the College within 4 years before the date of election.
- x. 5 other members”

Election of Office Bearers

The President informed the house that a position for Vice Patron has become vacant due to the demise of Dr. Ananda Soysa during the year. He said that the outgoing COM had approved to propose Mr. Geoffrey Alagaratnam P.C as a Vice Patron. Mr. Geoffrey Alagaratnam P.C. addressed the house and while appreciating the proposal, he declined to accept as he was of

the view that that there are past Presidents and many others who have served the OBU and College and are more deserving. He said he did not wish for his name to be recognized for serving the SPC OBU or College.

Mr. Gerry de Mel proposed Mr. Mahinda Saranapala's name as Vice Patron and Mr. Saranapala too declined.

The President proposed Mr. Michael Elias' name as the Vice Patron and the house accepted with applause. Mr. Elias accepted this proposal.

Nominated Past President

The President thereafter tabled the names of the following three Past Presidents, recommended by the outgoing committee to serve on the Committee of Management for the ensuing year, which proposal was also ratified by the house:

Election of the President: Mr. Asela Lihinikaduwa requested for the permission of the house to propose Mr. Ravika de Silva as his successor as the President of the SPC OBU.

The house agreed to this proposal with applause and a standing ovation. Mr. Ravika de Silva then received the President's medallion from Mr. Asela Lihinikaduwa.

Mr. Ramesh Fonseka objected to this and proposed Mr. Kevin Edwards for the post of President. Then Mr. Ravika de Silva removed the President's medallion. Before anyone was able to second it Mr. Kevin Edwards addressed the house.

He mentioned as he agreed with Rev. Fr. Rector that he will be stepping-down and requested the other contender also to follow the same.

Mr. Asela Lihinikaduwa proposed Mr. Ravika de Silva's name again as the President of the SPC OBU and the house agreed to his proposal with applause and standing innovation. Mr. Ravika de Silva then assumed the Chair.

He said his second area of focus would be to support the College with Rev. Fr. Rector and Management of the College in celebrating 100 years in January 2022. Some activities are likely to be organized by the SPC OBU and he committed the support of the SPC OBU.

Mr. Ravika de Silva said that sport has been a hallmark of St. Peter's College over the years. He said that he would like to urge the Sports Foundations under the SPC OBU to improve their effectiveness and efficiency in their contributions to the respective sports.

He said that he wished to contribute towards the overall improvement of values and standards of Peterite students through focused programmes organized by the SPC OBU with the College authorities.

He also said he hopes to initiate action to protect the intellectual property of St. Peter's College and the OBU through registration with the relevant authorities.

01. Read Notice convening the Meeting

The President welcomed everyone to the Special General Meeting. He mentioned that the Hony. General Secretary was unable to attend due to contracting Covid and therefore invited the Hony. Asst. General Secretary, Mr. Sanushka Perera to read the notice convening the meeting.

Mr. Sanushka Perera read the notice convening the meeting and mentioned the following guidelines for the meeting:

He started out by mentioning that the Virtual Special General Meeting was hosted by a third-party, namely TIKM events.

He went on to mention that while this is a Virtual Special General Meeting, there were a few members here who are physically present including the Rector of St. Peter's College and Patron of the OBU, Rev. Fr. Rohitha Rodrigo, the Nominated Past President and the Immediate Past President, the President, the Hony. Asst. General Secretary and the Hony. Treasurer, the Chairmen of the Finance Committee for the year 2019/20 and 2020/21, The Vice Presidents of the Old Boys Union and a few members of the Committee of Management. 04. To adopt the Re-Issued Audited Statement of Accounts for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2020.

The President mentioned that as the accounts were published on the website and therefore proceeded to vote to adopt the Re-Audited Financial Statements for the Financial Year 2019-20. After the members were provided 2 minutes to vote, the final vote was 99 for and 5 votes against, thereby the Re-Audited Statement of Accounts for the Financial Year 2019-20 were considered adopted.

05. To consider and if found fit to adopt the following Resolution which has been Proposed by the Committee of Management

The President read out the following Resolution which was proposed by the Committee of Management:

WHEREAS under and in terms of rule 10 of the Constitution of St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union the Annual General Meeting of the Union must be held on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Peter and, accordingly, was required to be held on 27 June 2021.

AND WHEREAS due to the COVID – 19 Pandemic and the resulting countrywide lockdown and the social distancing measures imposed by the Government of Sri Lanka the Annual General Meeting of the Union could not be held on the due

date.

WHEREFORE, this House hereby resolves that, in view of the extraordinary circumstances faced by St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union, for reasons beyond its control, the decision to hold the Annual General Meeting of St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union for the year 2020/ 2021 on Friday, 10 December 2021 by way of a Special General Meeting is endorsed and approved as lawfully valid.

After reading the above the President called for a vote to adopt the above resolution. After the members were provided 2 minutes to vote, the final vote was 98 for and 7 votes against, thereby the above resolution was considered adopted.

06. To consider and if found fit to adopt the following Resolution which has been Proposed by the Committee of Management

The President read out the following Resolution which was proposed by the Committee of Management:

WHEREAS under and in terms of rule 9 of the Constitution of St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union elections to certain specified offices, as set out therein, where required to be held at the Annual General Meeting of the Union.

AND WHEREAS due to the COVID – 19 Pandemic and the resulting countrywide lockdown and the social distancing measures imposed by the Government of Sri Lanka the Annual General Meeting could not be held on the due date.

AND WHEREAS due to the restrictions imposed by the lockdown and other social distancing measures in place it would not be administratively convenient to conduct contested elections at a General Meeting of the members.

AND WHEREAS the Committee of Management, at its meeting held on 21 October 2021, unanimously resolved to recommend to the House that, notwithstanding any rule of the constitution of the Union to the contrary, each and all of the members of the current Committee of Management continue in office for a further period of one year without conducting contested elections.

WHEREFORE, notwithstanding any provision of the Constitution of St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union to the contrary, this House hereby resolves that, in view of the extraordinary circumstances faced by the Union for reasons beyond its control, the present Committee of Management is permitted to continue in office for a further period of one year without any contested elections being held.

After reading the above the President called for a vote to adopt the above resolution. After the members were provided 2 minutes to vote, the final vote was 101 for and 6 votes against, thereby the above resolution was considered adopted.

07. To appoint an Auditor for the Financial Year 2020/21 and to authorize the Committee of Management to determine the remuneration.

The President then mentioned that as it was necessary to appoint an auditor for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2021, he requested the membership to vote on electing Gomes & Company to continue as the auditor of the SPCOBU and requested the authorization for the Committee of Management to determine the remuneration rate.

After the members were provided 2 minutes to vote, the final vote was 97 for and 7 votes against, thereby Gomes & Sons were elected as the Auditor of the St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union for the financial year ending 31st March 2021 and the Committee of Management was provided authorization to determine the remuneration.

08. To appoint an Auditor for the Financial Year 2021/22 and to authorize the Committee of Management to determine the remuneration.

The President then mentioned that as it was necessary to appoint an auditor for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2022, he requested the membership to vote on electing Gomes & Company to continue as the auditor of the SPCOBU and requested the authorization for the Committee of Management to determine the remuneration rate.

After the members were provided 2 minutes to vote, the final vote was 105 for and 3 votes against, thereby Gomes & Sons were elected as the Auditor of the St. Peter's College Old Boys' Union for the financial year ending 31st March 2022 and the Committee of Management was provided authorization to determine the remuneration.

09. Close of Meeting.
